Dear Colleagues,

In this past decade, surgery of the hip has seen phenomenal advances and major changes. These have led to the increasingly successful management of hitherto unexplained conditions causing painful loss of function in young and active patients. The hip joint today is much better understood than ever before, and new complexities have arisen. Open dislocation and hip arthroscopy have brought new solutions for lesions of the labrum and for offset abnormalities.

Total hip arthroplasty is a huge success, with more than a million implants undertaken around the world. In spite of its success, some patients present pain and discomfort that is not simple to elucidate, diagnose and treat. With implant loosening, infection and periprosthetic fractures always lurking in the background, causing ongoing damage to patients and anxiety to surgeons, a strong knowledge base and expertise are needed to tackle these dreaded complications. The latest innovative solutions to these difficult problems will be provided by the assembled experts, each renowned in his field.

Hip registry data is becoming the non-biased standard by which all hip implants must be evaluated. The latest information from the European registries will be presented.

Dysplastic hips remain a major problem in many parts of Europe. Classifications allowing a better understanding of this disabling disorder, along with therapeutic solutions, will be presented by world-class specialists in the field.

Most of the major complications related to modern hip surgery will be presented and discussed in a practical and pragmatic manner, with plenty of how-to tips and take-home messages.

We invite you to the springtime Athens 2012 EFORT Hip Course, to take advantage of the wealth of information that will be distilled and presented by a distinguished panel of experts on a major topic in orthopaedic surgery – the hip.

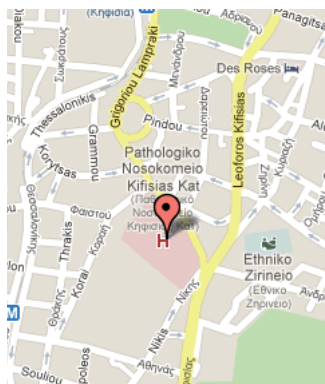
