- The annual swiss orthopaedics congress attracts on average approximately 2,500 attendees each year








Western Europe East Europe Rest of world













# Indices - average performance across all sessions Across all assessed sessions, the performance remains good








## **EFORT Congress demographic representation**



## **Geneva – at the heart of Europe**







### **Geneva – flights statistics**



- Direct regular flights to more than 134 international destinations, 25 of which are intercontinental
  - 15.2 million passengers in 2014 (+5% compared to 2013).
  - **187,596 aircraft** movements in 2014.
  - More than 81% of the aircrafts took off on time in 2014
  - There are 57 regular airlines, including 16 non-European
  - 45 countries linked to Geneva by a direct flight
- Geneva airport is one of the main easyJet hubs within Europe with more than 70 destinations.
- Other low cost carriers like Vueling, Eurowings, Pegasus and WizzAir have daily flights to Geneva.
- Long-haul direct destinations are:
  - New York: daily flights to JFK and EWR (Swiss + United)
  - Washington: daily flight (United)
  - Montréal/Toronto: daily flight (Air Canada, 1 stop at Montreal each way, same flight)
  - Dubai / Abu Dhabi / Doha: daily flight (Emirates / Etihad / Qatar Airways)
  - Jeddah and Riyadh: 3x/week each destination/daily in July-August (Saudi Arabia)
  - Kuwait: 2x/week (Kuwait Airways)
  - Beijing: 4x/week (Air China)
- 75-80% of flights are less than 4 hours including key destinations in the Middle East
- Destinations by continent:
  - Europe 90 %
  - Middle East and Asia 4,7 %
  - Americas 2,7 %
  - Africa 2,6 %









