As Prof. Czubak is an expert in PAO, he showed us different kinds of pelvic osteotomies. It was really interesting to see as I had never seen such kind of surgery before. We were even allowed to scrub in and assist.



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During the days, our group got closer and closer and we had a lot of fun. We could exchange many experiences and noticed that some clichés are really true but also refreshing.

We spent our last evening in Warsaw's city center where we ate our first Pirrogi, a typical polish dish and drank some polish beer in the beautiful old town.



The day after, we took the coach to the beautiful city of Poznan. There , we were very warmly welcomed by Prof.Romanowski and his resident Marta. After some lectures in the afternoon about hip and knee surgery, we very invited to Prof.Romanowskis house, where he and his wife had prepared a garden party or us fellows. Here we met other surgeons and residents from the DEGA University hospital Poznan and could talk, eat and relax in the beautiful garden .

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In Poznan, our days were split in surgery in the morning and lectures in the afternoon. All of the doctors were very well prepared and could answer all our questions about different surgeries. After our "official" time, they spent time with us to show us the beautiful old town of Poznan. The city is very vivid and young because of the big amount of students.

Very very fast our last evening arrived. We were invited by Prof.Romanowski and the Head of the University Hospital to an official dinner at a very nice restaurant.



On Saturday Morning, our last morning, we had the last lectures, bought some Polish sweets and drove all together back to Warsaw Chopin Airport. After a last cup of coffee, we all left for different destinations. But not without the promise, to meet again very soon.
